

People age 60-64, people with high risk conditions, and the continuation of operations for state government and continuity of local government:

- » People age 60-64.
- People 16-59 with 1 high risk condition as listed: Coloradans with cancer (defined as patients who are currently receiving treatment or have received treatment within the last month for cancer), chronic kidney disease, COPD, diabetes mellitus, Down syndrome, specific heart conditions (heart failure, cardiomyopathies or coronary heart disease, and severe valvular/congenital heart disease), obesity (BMI \geq 30kg/m^2), pregnancy, sickle cell disease, solid organ transplant. People with disabilities that prevent them from wearing masks.
- » Local continuity of local government defined as executives of those branches of government and a limited amount of essential support staff needed to provide for continuity of government.
- » Continuation of operations for state government is defined as those individuals defined by continuity of operations plans that each agency holds to continue to provide services.
- » Adults who received a placebo during a COVID-19 vaccine clinical trial.

 - Child care workers in licensed programs
 - Teachers (full-time, student teachers, and substitutes)
 - Bus drivers, school food service, counselors, paraprofessionals, administrative staff, safety workers, and other support services offered inside the school.
- Continuity of State Government
 - Members of the executive and judicial branches of government.

FRONTLINE ESSENTIAL WORKERS, COLORADANS WITH 2 OR MORE COMORBIDITIES

Vaccinations for this group will open up in early March, estimated date March 5.

Frontline workers like educators will be employer based efforts. We continue working with stakeholders to create a process for how to best vaccinate this group.
